PASTOR'S REPORT

2022 was another significant year for me as I officially finished my Seminary and Candidacy requirements for ordination. I completed seven seminary courses as I continue to grow in my theological education. From March 1, through December 31, I completed an internship here at Emmanuel. I would like to thank the Internship Committee (Jeff Heim - Chairman, Tammy Gregerson, Amanda Hansen, and Nancy TeSelle) as we met monthly to discuss progress on my Learning Service Agreement goals for my continued pastoral formation. On January 13, 2023, I go before the Candidacy Committee for my Approval Interview as the last step in the Candidacy process in preparation for ordination and an official call to serve here at Emmanuel.

Our youth programs remain strong as we alternate Wednesday evenings during the school year between LYFE and Confirmation programs. This past year the LYFE sessions focused on the parables of Jesus while Confirmation focused on the books of the New Testament. For more information regarding these programs please refer to the Learning Committee report on page 9.

I would like to thank Amanda Hansen and Sarah Smith for their leadership in the LYFE program. I would also like to thank Tammy Gregerson for her assistance with Confirmation as well as the Sunday children's message.

This past year we also reestablished our High School Youth program. In July of this year, we had five students (Carly Freidel, Bailey Holiday, Lacey Peterson, Addison Stansberry, and Emily Stansberry) participate in a camp at Camp Tomah Shinga in Junction City, Kansas. These students shared their experience in Church the Sunday after camp to inform the congregation of their experiences. I would like to thank Renee Petersen who attended with me as an adult sponsor. Since the trip the High School Youth group has started to meet monthly to share in food and fellowship combining fun projects with service projects.

This past fall we also started an Adult Bible Study. I am pleased to announce that we had fourteen people register to attend as on a weekly basis we share our thoughts and biblical interpretation on the book of Hebrews.

This past year also included several text messages, phone calls, and visits interacting with our membership. I also continued to reach out to members on their birthdays and anniversaries. Building upon relationships with the congregational membership remains a high priority for me. I appreciate the congregation informing me when we have a member who may need a visit, and the stops in the office just to visit with me.

God's Blessings as each of you continue on your own faith journeys in 2023.
