On February 11th through February 13th I attendede a First Call Retreat at the Saint Benedict Conference Center in Schuyler. What a great facility to spend time together with a group of newly ordained pastors (see picture above with Jesus looking over us) to share their experiences and learn from each other and our varied ministries. See description below from our Synod with their definition of the First Call Program.

As a newly ordained pastor or deacon of the ELCA, you might rightly ask the question, "I just finished my seminary work and my internship. Why do I need to do formation?" Of course, just as we tell the newly confirmed, learning and faith formation is a life-long project. But for those of you who are recently ordained, First Call Formation is an intentional program that every synod office in the ELCA requires to help you become acclimated to your new role, introduce you to clergy community, establish good communication with the synod office and other synod leaders, and act as a safety net of sorts while you find your feet. And while you are encouraged to seek out continuing education opportunities on your own (conferences, classes, retreats, etc...), the First Call Formation program also helps reinforce key components of pastoral ministry that will be critical for you to wrestle with during these first three years.

Every synod has the freedom to emphasize different themes in their own First Call Formation programs. However, here in the Nebraska Synod, we hope that all our first call pastors and deacons will more fully embody three core principles: 1) Integration 2) Accountability 3) Resiliency.

Of course, pastors and deacons need to be many things, including all the fruits of the Spirit! But these three principles really capture the most important areas of growth for the newly ordained that we hope every pastor and deacon will carry with them for decades to come.

The Nebraska Synod sponsored event was lead by Bishop Scott Johnson and Assistant to the Bishop Kristen Van Stee. Additionally this retreat included Timothy Siburg as our theme focused on stewardship.

I continue to enjoy visits in the office, so just stop in to say "hi" or have a discussion about your devotional practices you are engaged in.


Next class session will be held on April 10th at 6:00pm.






Bible study is the practice—whether individually or within a group—of reading, interpreting, and applying Scripture to daily life.
